

Remember to check the words as you read. Does it look right? Does it sound right? Does it make sense? Think Think about all the books you read or listened to today. Which one do you think has the best cover? Write Write about the book that you think has the best cover. Tell why. Ask Ask someone at your house which cover they think is the best. Turn them over and tap on the top to see which bowl's sound is high or low.</p>	<p><b>Be a Weather Reporter</b></p> <p>Get a sheet of paper and draw 3 lines down the paper. Above the first section, label it Date; above the second; label it Temperature; above the third; label it Clear or Cloudy and above the fourth section; label it Dry or Rainy. Next draw 4 lines across your paper so you have enough sections to record your weather observations for 5 days. Now you are ready to begin. Observe the weather and write down what you see each day. After 5 days, do you see any patterns? Can you predict what the 6th day of weather might be? <p><b>Counting</b> Dump a large pile of cheerios or other small items on a flat surface. Have students count the items. If the student attempts to count all of the items by 1s, encourage them to make groups of ten to count the items.
